- Welfare assistance – John Nichol (Student Welfare Coordinator) / Gill Van Der Ende (Chaplain)



PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.

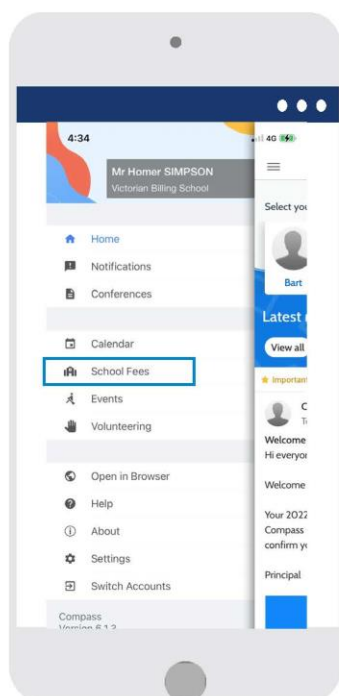

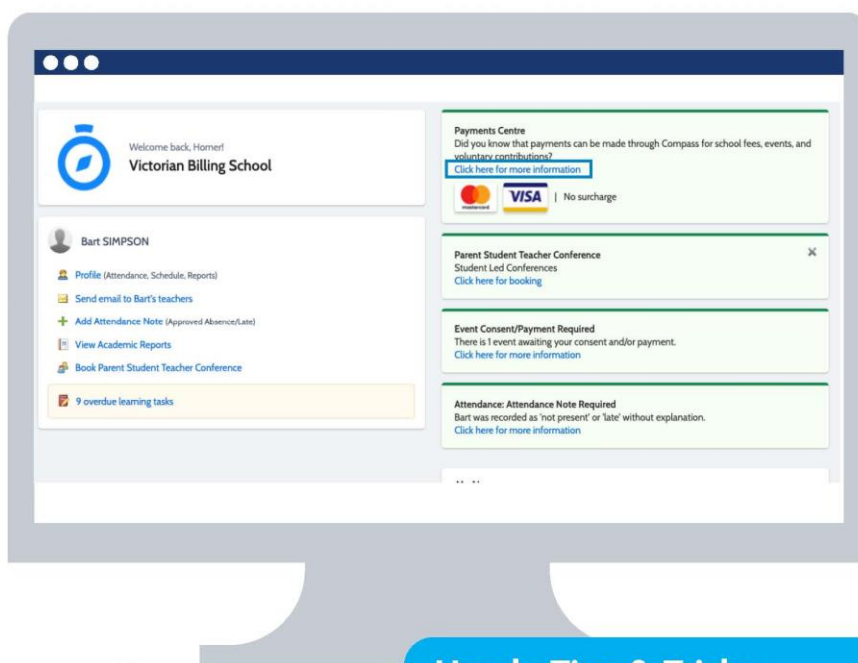
Compass App

2022 School Payments

Dear Parents and Carers,

High School is proud to offer a range of exemplary curricular and co-curricular programs to students across the school. While the Victorian Government supplies most of the school's funding, this is not sufficient to meet all the costs of the school's programs. All schools are dependent on locally raised funds to supplement government funding for curriculum programs, school services and resources. Locally raised funds in the form of parent contributions are essential for the operation of the school's extended learning program, specialist staff and the provision of additional equipment.

Parent Payment Policy

The Department of Education and Training (DET) Parent Payment Policy provides advice on the different types of payments that schools may request from parents and outlines the procedures and protocols to which schools must adhere. The High School Council is responsible for developing and approving a school-level parent payment arrangement that is compliant with the Department's policy. The DET policy is available here: <https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/gal/parent-payment/policy> or a hard copy is available on request from the general office.

Financial help arrangements

High School offers a range of supports to families who are experiencing financial hardship and are unable to make the parent payment. The DET also provides a range of supports to families that will complement the school supports. The school-based arrangements could include establishing payment instalment plans and providing access to school resources. The DET arrangements include access to a range of government-funded support programs including the State School's Relief Fund, the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEEF) as well as a range of student scholarships. Families should contact the school via 0922 7500 to enquire about these supports.

The High School Council wishes to ensure that increases in parent payment contributions are minimised. However, it cannot be too strongly stressed that the viability of many of our innovative programs is dependent on your support via the payment of the voluntary parent contribution. Payment of the parent contribution is preferred at the time of course confirmation and payment of the school fees.

Course Confirmation

We ask parents and carers to confirm enrolment through the course confirmation process by Monday 16 November 2020 via this online portal. The Principal and the Business Manager are available if you wish to discuss any matters concerning payment. The High School Council relies upon and thanks you for your continued support.
