Languages

It is amazing to reflect on how the year has raced by and a pleasure to see how our language learners have progressed. It really has made a world of difference having a full year back at school without major disruptions or lockdowns, not least of all because we were exploring the world in the classroom through language, geography and culture.

There have been so many highlights including: The wonderful Written and Oral CATs submitted; the successes in the Education Perfect World Championships (placed 13th in German out 1228 competing schools worldwide); two (almost unattainable) certificates of the 10,000 point Elite level, reached by Aliyah Orwin doing Year 8 Chinese and Bailey Paget in Year 9; the amazing exposition of student work at the Night of Excellence including the winner of Languages' People's Choice award by Hollie McInnes. But let's focus on what most students enjoyed saw as the highlight: The first Year 8 Cultural Excursion since 2019!

The two language groups separated at Flinders Street. The German students visited the Immigration Museum for the first time ever. The

Museum explains how this country has been shaped by the many and varied waves of immigrants that these shores have welcomed. Most students were able to find something they could relate to, based on their own family histories. At the Hofbräuhaus, the well-known German Restaurant, students were treated to a delicious feast!

Our Chinese students visited the Chinese Museum and explored the history of Chinese settlement during the Gold Rush. Our students learnt about the world's biggest Chinese dragon, saw Chinese textiles, costumes, furniture and a life-size Terracotta warrior. We learnt about the history of Qin and Han Dynasties, viewing a range of artefacts including a Jade Burial Suit and an ancient seismograph which was invented by Chinese scientist Zhang Heng in the Eastern Han period 132 AD. Then we lunched at the 'Shanghai Village' restaurant for a delicious treat. It was an exciting and informative day for our Year 8 students.

Celebrating 30 years of stories

The Indigenous word 'Wakakirri' means 'to dance a story'. A great story can change the way people think about the world around them. Wakakirri is Australia's largest Performing Arts event for schools with over 180 taking part in 2022. Participating schools are inspired by the Wakakirri ethos 'great stories inspire change'. This year, our extremely talented dance troupe participated in the National Wakakirri Festival and were thrilled to take home several National Awards for their performance entitled 'The True Cost'.



THE STORY BEHIND THE PERFORMANCE:

A large part of the learning focus for the Wakakirri program at Mooroolbark College emphasises changing perspectives and taking action as a critical part of being an active learner. Many students were shocked to discover the impact fast fashion has on both our environment and humanity.

Our performance examined the misconnection between garment workers and consumers within the fast fashion industry. Responding to the simple question "who made my clothes?" the performance illuminated the hands behind the products we wear.

Initially inspired by Andrew Morgan's 'The True Cost' - students explored the themes of overconsumption, greed and sacrifice via an exposition of garment workers and a young shopaholic. Designed to be a powerful form of activism, generating important conversations around social injustice, our performers prompted the audience to consider the true cost of the clothes we wear. The complexity of the item required focused movement and adroit choreography, along with high level acting skills to convey the magnitude of the global fast fashion crisis.



Respected Australian actress and dancer Kristin Wantenaar (nee Agnoli) was extremely enthusiastic in her praise of the talent on show and the sophisticated standard of Mooroolbark's performance.



It is an ongoing delight and privilege to spend time with the students, to experience their courage, creativity, compassion, energy, resilience, and sense of fun and to watch them grow from a hesitant Year 7 student into a young adult with a clear sense of who they are and how they want to move forward.

Wellbeing is not the sole preserve of this team; we have a House/ Homegroup system that is set up for the chief purpose of making sure each

student has a caring adult who will walk beside them through their high school journey. Research tells us that when a young person has an adult, outside the family who connects with them and looks out for them, then that person will be better protected from the crashing waves and curve balls that life throws at them. Our aim is that all our students will feel cared for and looked after, knowing that there is someone in their corner.

Moving into our newly completed, wellbeing centre has been a highlight for both staff and students. It has given us a large, shared space that is welcoming and safe. It has also brought the Houses together with our Wellbeing staff to reinforce our united approach to student care.

We are so grateful that we can play a small part in the journey of these amazing young people as they grapple with the joys and challenges that they will inevitably encounter in the years to come.













This year proved to be a lucky one for the running of the annual Debutante Ball, with both the 58th and 59th Debutante Balls being held over the March long weekend.


